#### UPPER PHASE NEWSLETTER

Throughout this week, our Year 4 students have been engaged in a diverse range of learning experiences across various subjects. In English, they have been honing their descriptive writing skills by creating vivid settings and incorporating similes to enhance their descriptions. In Maths, the focus has been on subtracting fractions and whole amounts, developing their numeracy skills. During P.E sessions, the students have been mastering invasion games like Netball, learning about finding space both in attack and defence. In Mandarin lessons, they have been expanding their vocabulary by discussing colours. In Computing, the students have been understanding the importance of recognising acceptable and unacceptable content online. Year 5 has been lucky enough to have visitors from Warwick University, who came into our school to teach children about nutrition and sanitation. The presentation covered

how to be hygienic through various techniques such as soap washing and covering our mouths when we cough. They also covered how to reduce water wastage and why it is important because water is a valuable resource. Afterwards, they discussed ways in which a healthy diet can be created and how malnutrition can set in if we don't have enough of the right food types. The children then learnt about this content in context with the wider world to understand how malnutrition and famine are affecting some groups around the world and how UNICEF try to support those communities.
