Year 4 have had a productive week of learning across various subjects! In English, they have delved into the world of writing biographies, drawing inspiration from the captivating life of Philippe Petit. Their focus has been on refining their writing skills through editing and perfecting their own biographies. In numeracy, the children have been honing their understanding of decimals and fractions. They have been actively exploring ways to combine different hundredths to form whole numbers, as well as mastering the art of partitioning decimals and comparing them to efficiently order the numbers by size. Moreover, in computing, the pupils have been actively engaged in collecting data and discovering innovative ways to present their findings using digital technology. They have also gained insights into the intricate workings of computer

networks, learning how these systems are constructed and communicate within a broader framework.

This week in Year 5, the children have been exploring what constitutes a well-crafted newspaper report. Using the captivating tale of 'Kensuke's Kingdom' by Michael Morpurgo, the class is honing their skills to compose an article detailing the tragic vanishing of the young boy at sea. In numeracy sessions, the pupils are delving into the art of using a protractor to gauge angles, in addition to solving for multiple missing angles either on a straight line or within a 360-degree circle. Furthermore, in Physical Education, students have embarked on a fresh chapter of learning under the guidance of the Sky Blues in the Community group. They are engaging in health and fitness activities, along with theoretical lessons on maintaining personal well-being. The week started with discovering how to measure their own pulse rate and understanding the varying factors influencing its fluctuations. This week in Year 6, our pupils have been fully engaged in their learning across various subjects. In English, the children have delved into the intriguing short animation 'Freak', exploring the complex emotions and challenges faced by a young protagonist. Through rich discussions, they have analysed the atmospheric elements of the video and honed their vocabulary to effectively convey these themes in their writing. In numeracy, the students have revisited the concept of measuring angles within a 360-degree circle and utilised their understanding of opposite angles to tackle advanced reasoning and mastery-level problems. This has strengthened their problem-solving skills and mathematical fluency. During the afternoons, our budding artists have immersed themselves in the world of William Morris, studying his timeless pattern designs. They have marvelled at his iconic creations and experimented with crafting their own wallpaper designs inspired by his distinctive style.
